## Rebecca Walker

## Tuesday, Feb. 26, 7-9 p.m. at Southdale Area Library



Walker frequently writes about race, skin color, reproductive freedom, domestic violence, and female sexuality. Her first book, To Be Real: Telling the Truth and Changing the Face of Feminism, deals with the struggle of young women to redefine feminism; it has been used in women studies courses throughout the country. Her memoir, Black, White & Jewish: Autobiography of a

Shifting Self (2001) gives an intimate look at her life growing up biracial in a racially divided world. The 1992 cum laude graduate of Yale University founded the Third Wave Direct Action Corporation, a national nonprofit organization dedicated to developing young women's leadership and activism, and the Third Wave Foundation.
