Dear Madeline.

My "philosophy" can be distilled (I hope!) from "Where Have All The Moonies Gone?," "Why Catalog," "Cataloging Shtik," and "Proposed: a subject cataloging Code for public, school, and Community Vollege Libraries" (all enclosed).

At HCL, we operated within the frameworks of LCSH and AACR, but freely amending, expanding, and correcting those codes or systems. (DDC, too.)

Some measure of HCL headings ultimately adopted by LC may be gleaned from the two "Who did it when?" supplements published in the HCL CATALOGING BULLETIN. Subsequently, I reported LC adoptions in my internal bimonthly and quarterly reports (samples enclosed).


It can't be automatically assumed that because "we" did it first, IC followed suit. The "proof" would be a reference to HCL in IC's own authority record.

JEWISH QUESTION, for instance, got trashed not because I suggested doing so in PREJUDICES or due to HCL's substitution of JEWS--RELATIONS WITH GENTILES and JEWS--GOVERNMENT POLICY. It seems to have happened because a Philadelphia colleague, furious with LC inaction, contacted the Anti-Defamation League, which in turn queried KC. Similarly, HCL instituted a form for NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE years ago, yet LC only created the same heading after Senator Wellstone directly asked them about it (I admit, at my urging).

Within the last year I've successfully recommended WEST VIRGINIA MINE WARS (with assistance from the West Virginia Labor History Association) RES SINGLE-PAYER HEALTH CARE, COMMUNITY-SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE, SEX TOYS, QUEER THEORY, KRUMPING, PLUTOCRACY, and AMERICAN DREAM.

Still uncreated, however, are CULTURE WARS, EROTOPHOBIA, SECOND-WAVE FEMINISM, THIRD-WAVE FEMINISM, ANTI-ARABISM, POLYAMORY, BUTCH AND FEMME, TRANSGENDERED PERSONS, STUDENT ANTISWEATSHOP MOVEMENT, SWEATSHOP-FREE PRODUCTS, RECOVERED FACTORY MOVEMENT, GI MOVEMENT, INFOSHOPS, and SLOW MOVEMENT. And LC has failed to replace ARMENIAN MASSACRES with ARMENIAN GENOCIDE and HERMAPHRODITISM with INTERSEXUALITY. Moreover, something like a third or more of the recommendations and problems mentioned in PREJUDICES have still to be addressed (more than 30 years later), including the bevy of "Christocentric" forms.

I would offhandedly estimate that literally a thousand (maybe twice or 3 times that) of HCL's original headings have <u>not</u> been established by LC. And the number of unique cross-references they neglected to input would be staggering.

The Cataloging Shtik

- That making materials quickly and painlessly accessible through the catalog is much less important than picking, buying, stamping, labeling, pocketing, and preserving those same materials.
- That our illustrious "experts," "leaders," and "authorities" (mostly from academia and the research conglomerate) really know better than we do what's good for public, school, and college libraries.
- That universal "standards" like *ISBD* are sacred and inevitable, to be implemented everywhere regardless of whether they make any sense or contribute to better service.
- That PLA, RTSD, CSD, YASD, etc. can be trusted to behave like consumer advocates (rather than stockholders or sweethearts) with respect to LC, Baker & Taylor, Josten's, Brodart, and other cataloging products.
- Abbreviations; e.g., not the original "illus." nor lately reduced "ill." (Users and staff alike are already bombarded—in fact, overloaded—with acronyms, symbols, and contractions.)
- Secret punctuation—like slashes, dashes, and equal signs—that only the "elect" can comprehend.
- Mandatory author statements following titles when the name is identical to the main entry and thus redundant; e.g.,

Herndon, Brodie.
Time clocks; by Brodie Herndon.

- Brackets (understood—if at all—exclusively by library types and utterly insignificant to everyone else).
- Pointless, space-wasting "1st ed." statements.
- Mysterious Latin ciphers—e.g., [s.l.], [s.n.]—that could well make the uninducted feel like stupid jerks.

Friends, we've been conned into believing

What we don't need

- Roman pagination (seldom extensive nor of any tangible value).
- Centimer spine sizes. (Call numbers for tall works ordinarily indicate the odd size by means of something like a "folio" prefix, anyway, so who needs "34 cm."?)
- ISBN numbers and prices, the former because no one (outside of acquisitions) gives a damn, the latter because the figure's likely to be much higher even before the card gets filed.
- Bibliography and index notes, so common that they've become meaningless.
- Archaic, foolish, clumsy, inauthentic, and biased subject terms that hamper searching, damage the library's credibility, and peddle misinformation. (Examples: MAMMIES; ILLEGITIMACY; MOTOR-TRUCKS; RIME; GIPSIES; CRUELTY TO CHILDREN; WATER-CLOSETS; EUROPEAN WAR, 1914—1918; YELLOW PERIL; AGED; DEGLUTITION DIS-ORDERS; MOVING-PICTURES; DWELLINGS; FOREMEN; STATESMEN; REFUSE COLLECTION VEHICLES.)
- The concealment of material on current and often vital topics by subject-cataloging it under remote or improbable rubrics. (Examples: "Reggae music" under JAZZ ENSEMBLES; "Cohabitation" under SEX AND LAW OF COLLEGE STUDENTS—SEXUAL BEHAVIOR; "Food co-ops" under COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES OF FOOD INDUSTRY AND TRADE; "Sexism in education" under SEX DIFFERENCES IN EDUCATION; "Political repression in America" under COMMUNISM—UNITED STATES—1917-; "Homesteading" under AGRICULTURE—HANDBOOKS, MANUALS, ETC.; "Job hunting" under APPLICATIONS FOR POSITIONS: "Third World literature" under LITERATURE, MODERN—20TH CENTURY; "Smoking and health" under TOBACCO—PHYSIOLOGICAL EFFECT; "Laetrile" under CANCER—PERSONAL NARRATIVES.)
- DDC Phoenixes—completely "remodeled" schedules "prepared with little or no reference to earlier editions"—that wreck callnumber integrity and frustrate browsing at all but the few libraries that can afford to reclassify their existing stock.
- CIP entries frequently so incomplete and based on such scanty data that they're virtually unusable.
- Hierarchical filing that wrongly assumes users know (or can guess) what mischievous librarians have decided to file first, last, and in the middle.

What we do need

• Determination of authors' names from the title page or container, recognizing that some authors write or compose under various names, all of them being equally "legitimate." (As a practical result, mysteries by Gordon Ashe, Michael Halliday, Kyle Hunt, J.J. Marric, Anthony Morton, and Jeremy York would have been entered—and shelved—under "Ashe," "Halliday," "Hunt," "Marric," "Morton," and "York" instead of being totally lumped together under the late author's semi-sanctified real name, John Creasey. "Creasey" and the six pseudonyms, of course, could be easily connected by notes; e.g., "For works written by this author under other names, see: . . .")

CIA and the cult of intelligence.

The rise and fall of the city of Mahagonny. Added entry: Mahagonny.

The persecution and assassination of Marat as performed by the inmates of the Asylum of Charenton under the direction of the Marquis de Sade. Added entry: Marat/Sade.

Added entries: Workers' self-management in the Spanish Revolution, 1936-1939. The Spanish Revolution, 1936-1939.

The case of the fabulous fake.

Added entry: The fabulous fake case.

- Age- and media-integrated catalogs that freely intermix children's and adult materials, as well as print and A/V items, favoring no one genre nor medium over another. (Among other things, this means no "special" subheads for—JUVENILE LITERATURE,—PHONODISCS,—VIDEO CASSETTES,—KITS, etc.)
- The timely creation of new DDC numbers to handle contemporary subjects like "Alternative energy sources," "Feminism," and "Workers' control."
- A comprehensive index to the *Dewey Decimal Classification* that swiftly and directly links topics and numbers. (Try finding "Prison reform," "Wife beating," "Intellectual freedom," or "Vasectomy" in the 18th edition index.)
- A national cataloging center for nonresearch libraries if LC and the major vendors refuse to shape up.
